Monday's Safety: Critical Error Reduction Techniques (C.E.R.T.)

This is part three of a four-part weekly series dedicated to the SafeStart Critical Error Reduction Techniques.

What causes people to make mistakes? Can human error be minimized? Yes. SafeStart behavior-based safety approaches help reduce human error through observation, training and repetition.



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Four Critical Error Reduction Techniques help reduce critical mistakes. This week's focus is the third technique: Analyze close calls and small errors.

So many little injuries or close calls occur compared to serious injuries, but they're all caused by the same risk. If we could learn from the "nonserious" ones, we wouldn't have to agonize over the serious ones. So, whenever you make a mistake, bump into something, or momentarily lose your balance — even if you don't fall down — ask yourself, why?

Analyze those close calls and small errors. Near misses allow us to focus on what caused the event rather than who. Analyzing and discussing what caused the close call acknowledges the inevitability of error and proactively seeks to identify latent threats.


